My Brothers,

During the season of Lent, we are asked to prepare ourselves for the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord. It is a time of fasting, abstinence, and prayer. Each of us must make the most of these 40 days. One way to prepare yourself is to participate in the 40-cans for Lent program. Each day in Lent, take a can or package of non-perishable food out of your family's pantry, and put it aside for those in need. We will collect the cans at each council activity and meeting in Lent, so please bring your collected cans to the council during Lent. Our Charity Chairman, Bob Rolufs, will distribute the collected food to local agencies involved in feeding the hungry.

You can also participate in the annual Founder's Day Walking Pilgrimage. Starting after the 9:00 AM Mass on Saturday, March 25 at the Church of the Ascension, our pilgrims will walk around the streets of Saratoga, while praying the Rosary. Our route takes just enough time to finish 5 decades. We'll then have a short prayer service at the Venerable Father Michael McGivney Shrine on the grounds of the Church of the Ascension, followed by a short reception.

You may also take the opportunity of Lent to continue forming yourself in the knowledge of our Faith. The Supreme Council has many resources available for a Knight and his family. Perhaps you can look at Supreme's "Building the Domestic Church" new particularly program, the Apostolic Exhortation "Into the Breach" by Most Rev. Thomas Olmstead, the Bishop of Phoenix, which is available as a pamphlet or free pdf download as part of the Veritas Series from the Catholic Information Service. The CIS is funded by the per-capita fees each of us pay as part of our annual dues.

Chaplain's Message

Ash Wednesday 2017

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of blessing ashes made from palm branches blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday, and placing them on the heads of participants to the accompaniment of the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and into dust you shall return." Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting, is the first day of Lent in Western Christianity. It occurs 46 days (40 fasting days, if the six Sundays, which are not days of fast, are excluded) before Easter and can fall as early as February 4 or as late as March 10. According to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus spent 40 days fasting in the desert, where he endured temptations by Satan. Lent originated as a mirroring of this, fasting 40 days as preparation for Easter. Every Sunday is a commemoration of the Sunday of Christ's resurrection and so as a



feast day on which fasting was inappropriate. Accordingly, Christians fasted from Monday to Saturday (six days) during six weeks and from Wednesday to Saturday (four days) in the preceding week, thus making up the number of 40 days.

Council of Vienne in 1311-1312 A.D.

Held just 37 years after the Second Council of Lyons, this Council was held in Vienne, a small town on the Rhone River in France. It was called principally because Philip IV, King of France wanted the Church to disband the Knights Templar so the King could take the Knights' lands and treasury, both of which were extremely vast. Over 200 Bishops and Abbotts attended under the direction of Pope Clement V. The Council, surprisingly, found that there was insufficient evidence to disband and excommunicate the Knights Templar. During the five months of the Council the fathers went on to discuss many matters including new crusades both to the east as well as to Granada in Spain to drive out the Moors. While the original records have been lost, the existing record has been pieced together from medieval sources. There are 38 decrees from this Council, the most interesting are:

Decree 1. ... sanctifying grace and the virtues are conferred in baptism on both infants and adults, as more probable and more in harmony with the words of the saints and of modern doctors of theology.

Decree 8. We strictly command local ordinaries (Bishops) to admonish by name three times clerics who publicly and personally engage in the butcher's trade or conduct taverns, that they cease to do so within a reasonable time to be fixed by the ordinary and never resume such trades.

Decree 9. ... we ordain by the present constitution that any cleric wearing striped or variegated clothing in public, without a good reason, is automatically suspended. (Clerics were to wear the proper dress of their station or order).

Decree 14. We forbid the monks all excesses or irregularity with regard to clothes, food, drink, bedding and horses. At least once every month both inside and outside the monastery, each and all of the monks must go to confession, and on the first Sunday of each month they should receive communion in the monastery.

Decree 24. We desire earnestly that holy church should be well supplied with catholic scholars acquainted with the languages most in use by unbelievers. Schools in Paris, Oxford, Bologna and Salamanca should have at least two catholic scholars extremely well versed in each of three languages: Hebrew, Arabic and Chaldaic.

Decree 25. We enjoin on catholic princes who hold sovereignty over Saracens (who have minaret calls) they give consideration to the disgrace heaped on both them and other Christians. They are to remove this offence altogether from their territories.

Decree 26. The apostolic see has received many complaints that some inquisitors, appointed by it to suppress heresy, have overstepped the limits of the power given to them. They occasionally so enlarge their authority to oppress the innocent under pretext of piety and results in harm to the faithful. Henceforth all this work will be done by diocesan bishops and by inquisitors appointed by the Apostolic See. All worldly affection, hatred and fear shall be put aside, as also any seeking of temporal advantage. We decree that the bishops and the inquisitors may act independently of one another. While heresy is a grave offence, it is also a grave offence and deserving of severe punishment to impute maliciously such wickedness to the innocent.
