Thank You, Jesus

Since Mary is Jesus' mother, we must conclude that she is also the Mother of God: If Mary is the mother of Jesus, and if Jesus is God, then Mary is the Mother of God. There is no way out of this logical conclusion. Fr. Michael McGivney showed his reverence for Mary and prayed to her often. We are encouraged to follow his example when we pray for our special needs. As the mother of God, Mary is the great intervener. If you have a special need verbalize it to Mary and Venerable Michael J. McGivney. Share the results with your fellow Knights who need encouragement to accept the direction that God is showing us.

Council of Basel, Ferrara, Florence 1431-1445 A.D.

Held just 18 years after the Council of Constance, this Council was begun in Basel in 1431. Its principal reason was to bring Eastern Catholics into communion with the church and the Pope. After a few years, however, the council veered off track and the Pope at the time, Eugenius IV, moved it to Ferrara in 1438 ostensibly because the Eastern Bishops could reach it more easily. The underlying reason for the move was that the Council in Basel attempted to assert authority over the Pope. (Some of the recalcitrant Bishops in Basel, however, instead of going to Ferrara, elected their own anti-pope.) Ferrara, however, soon had a plague threat and the Council was again moved, this time to Florence, in 1439.

There were 25 sessions held in Basel, all of which were overturned at Ferrara. The 5th session at Ferrara transferred the Council to Florence.

Of the sessions at Florence, four of them, 8, 11, 13 and 14 dealt with the return to full communion with the Armenians, Copts, Syrians, Chaldeans and Maronites. Some, but not all, of the eastern lung of the church was now reunited with the western lung. Sessions 8 and 11 laid out some basic Catholic teaching and are worth repeating today.

Session 8. There are seven sacraments of the new Law, namely baptism, confirmation, Eucharist, penance, extreme unction, orders and matrimony, which differ greatly from the sacraments of the old Law. The latter were not causes of grace, but only prefigured the grace to be given through the passion of Christ; whereas the former, ours, both contain grace and bestow it on those who worthily receive them. The first five of these are directed to the spiritual perfection of each person in himself, the last two to the regulation and increase of the whole church.

Three of the sacraments, namely baptism, confirmation and orders, imprint indelibly on the soul a character, that is, a kind of a stamp, which distinguishes it from the rest. Hence they are not repeated in the same person. The other four, however, do not imprint a character and can be repeated.

The days of certain feasts were decreed to be: annunciation – March 25; birth of John the Baptist – June 24; birth of our Savior – December 25; circumcision – January 1; epiphany – January 6; and, presentation of our Lord in the temple (or the purification of the mother of God) – February 2.

Session 11. This session defined all inspired books of the Old and New Testaments.

The Council said it firmly believes, professes and preaches that never was anyone, conceived by a man and a woman, liberated from the devil's dominion except by faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the mediator between God and humanity, who was conceived without sin, was born and died. He alone by his death overthrew the enemy of the human race, cancelling our sins, and unlocked the entrance to the heavenly kingdom, which the first man by his sin had locked against himself and all his posterity.

The Council said it firmly believes, professes and preaches that all who are outside the catholic church, not only pagans but also Jews or heretics and schismatics, cannot share in eternal life and will go into the everlasting fire which is prepared for the devil and his angels, unless they are joined to the catholic church before the end of their lives ... and that nobody can be saved, no matter how much he has given away in alms and even if he has shed his blood in the name of Christ, unless he has persevered in the bosom and unity of the catholic church.

Who's at Mass?

Do you ever wonder who's participating with you when you are at Mass? Of course you know that like the picture, the Saints in heaven (the Church triumphant), those in purgatory (the Church suffering), and those living on earth (the Church militant) are all in attendance. The Communion of Saints is an actuality, particularly during the Sacrifice of the Mass.

But what about those humans who are in the same church with you for the same Mass? Don't you ever wonder who they are and what's going on in their lives both temporally and spiritually? I like to think that maybe there is some great saint in our midst at Mass. Maybe even a depraved sinner whose is undergoing great repentance and conversion of heart is there. Possibly someone is near me whose life will be forever changed by the graces bestowed by this Mass. To me those thoughts are an important part of the Mass experience. You never know who is in attendance.

In 2012 Pat and I attended a Catholic Answers conference in Oceanside. The keynote speaker was the Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of San Diego, Cirilo Flores. A native southern Californian, he was a dynamic speaker who was so obviously in love with Jesus and the Faith that he had the audience in the palm of his hand in the first two minutes.

In the course of his address he mentioned that he went to Stanford University to obtain his law degree. While at Stanford he said he



attended Mass at the Newman Center, which at the time was celebrated in St. Anne's Chapel in Palo Alto. He went on to note that some "screwy" things were going on there at that time.

After his speech Pat and I went to talk with him. I, in particular, was interested in his comment about the Newman Center because that's where we went to Mass at about the same time as the future Bishop. He noted that after one particular Mass the pastor announced that he was being kicked out of the priesthood for having fallen in love with a woman and marrying her. Guess what? We were there too!!

Bishop Flores became the Bishop of the San Diego diocese in 2013 but had a stroke and died in 2014 at the young age of 66. May his soul rest in peace.

So, you never know who's with you at Mass — maybe even a future Bishop!
